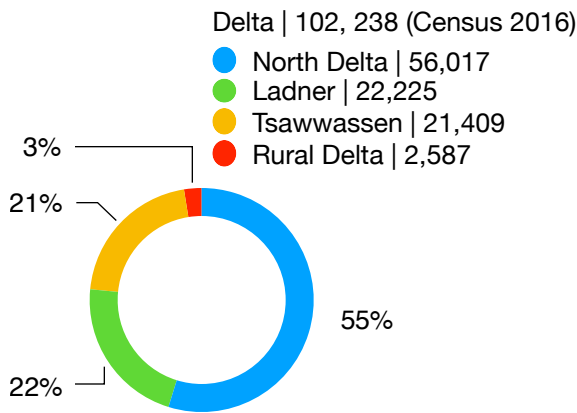

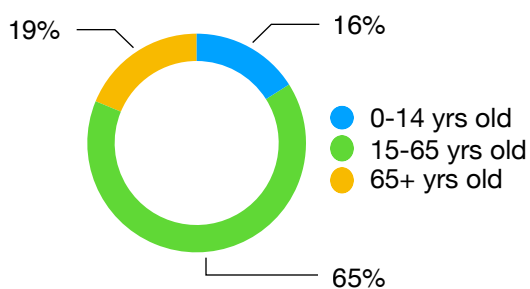
Population by Community



Population Growth

- In recent decades, Delta population growth was at 2.5% per Census period (550 persons per year), slower than that of the region (6.5% per Census period).
- In the last 10 years, the greatest population growth has been in North Delta (~440 persons per year).
- It is projected that in 20 years, ~124,594 residents will live in Delta*.

Between 2006 and 2016

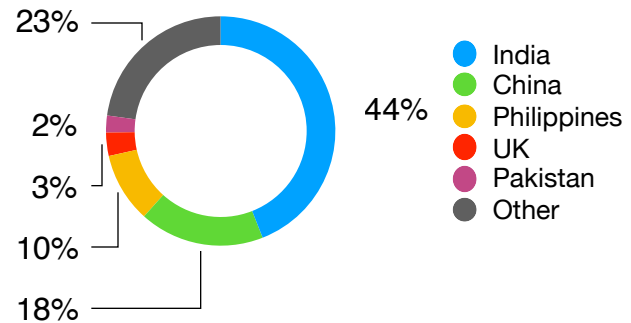
- The greatest population decline was seen for those under the age of 14 (1,750).
- The greatest population increase was observed amongst those between 65 and 84 years old (5,710).
- Ladner and Tsawwassen had a significantly higher proportion of the older population than North Delta.

Indigenous Population

In 2016, there were 2,710 people that identified as Aboriginal living in Delta (~2.6% of the total population); these are the persons living outside of the Tsawwassen First Nation lands where 240 persons identify as Aboriginal.

Recent Immigrant Population | 3,350**



- In 2016, there were 31,230 immigrants in Delta (31% of the total population).
- The majority of growth experienced in Delta between 2011 and 2016 occurred as a result of increased immigration to the area.
- The majority of all immigrants live in North Delta.

Ethnic Diversity

- In 2016, there were 36,300 Delta residents who identify as 'visible minority', which represents 36% of total population.
- From 2011 to 2016, the visible minority population in Delta has grown by 22%.
